




Topic:

Reading is a lifelong skill. Please help us encourage your child to read every day!:

Children have access to Reading Express.

Everytime their reading record is signed this will be noted in class and children can earn certificates for every 18 reads.

Please encourage your children to read 10-15 minutes daily. They can write in their own reading records but need to be signed by an adult for it to count towards the certificate count.

Shared home learning ENGLISH

- Encourage them to read every night and ask questions focussing on inference and deduction about what they have read to check their understanding.
- Ensure they learn their weekly spellings - display the words at home.

MATHEMATICS

- Help them to learn their times tables focussing on 3,4 and 8's.
- Use knowledge of times tables to aid division. $3 \times 4 = 12$ so $12 \div 3 = 4$

SCIENCE AND TOPIC

- Ask them about what they are learning in topic and science to find out what they have learnt so far.

Project Title: Rampaging Romans

Focus Subjects: English, History, D&T

Subject: English

The children will be writing adventure stories based around a familiar text. We will be using Pie Corbett text mapping to structure the story appropriately. We will be developing their creativity by encouraging them to change key parts of the story and using figurative language, speech punctuation, paragraphs and a variety of sentence structures.

Subject: History/Science

Science: Inspirational scientist
History: Romans

Subject: Computing/DT

DT: To design, make and evaluate their own Roman shields. Children will understand the importance of design.
Computing: To use tools and publisher effectively.

Skills

Science: to research a variety of inspirational scientists and their discoveries.
History: To order events chronologically, know and understand about past events before comparing them to our lives today.

Skills

DT: design their shield, using materials and joining accurately, then evaluating the effectiveness of their design.
Computing: To use publisher and create shapes for a purpose.

Knowledge

Science: Know about scientists' discoveries and their significance.
History: Know what life was like during the Roman times and understand how they impact the way we live today.

Knowledge

Computing: To use desktop publishing features effectively for a purpose.
