New Early Years Curriculum

Explore familiar and unfamiliar roles and experiences.

Communicate in a two way conversation.

Understand my feelings and respond to the feelings of others.

Solve problems independently with resilience.

AREAS OF LEARNING ...

The prime areas are the building blocks for children's learning.

- Personal social and emotional development
- Communication and language
- Physical development

The specific areas are the individual subjects.

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding of the world
- Expressive art and design.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Encourages children to be independent and to interact with other children and adults.

Helps children to become confident, safe, secure and ready to learn from new experiences.

Develops practical skills such as dressing, undressing etc







COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

Encourages children to develop conversational skills.

Will help children to develop listening and concentration skills.

Enables children to begin to hear sounds in words and to link these sounds to letters.





How do children learn words?

- Young children (Early Years and Key Stage 1) learn words through hearing them. They need to encounter them up to 12 times before they will recall and use them.
- Older children (Key Stage 2) learn words through reading them, but will need support to understand the word in context of the text.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Supports children's healthy development.

Supports children to hold tools such as pencils and paintbrushes

Helps them to develop a sense of space around themselves and others.







Encourages balance.

P.E

P.E is taught by Mr Byford and Mr Newland every Thursday.

The children will learn to retell stories, instructions off by heart using actions and story maps.

PHONICS

At the leys we follow the Leys letters programme.

The programme encourages children to learn a new phoneme a day.

It helps children to form their letters.

It allows children to read simple words and know their meaning.

It helps children apply their phonic knowledge when writing sentences.







MATHEMATICS





Children will gain a deep understanding of numbers to 10 including numerical patterns, number bonds and sharing. They will learn to subitise to 5.



UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD





Children will learn about the past and present, the natural world and different people and cultures



EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

Children will learn to create art using a range of different materials and be encouraged to use their imagination.







A TYPICAL DAY

- 08:50–09:15 Children complete fine motor skill activities.
- 09:15—9.45 The children have a discrete phonics lesson which includes reading.
- 9.45-10.00 Snack
- 10.00-10.20 The children have a discrete phonics lesson which includes letter formation and writing.
- 10:20—11:20 Child Initiated Learning. Children choose which activities they would like to explore inside and outside and their learning is guided by an adult.
- 11:20 11:45 Whole class Talk for Writing.
- 11:45 12:00 Story and getting ready for lunch.
- 12:00—13:00 Lunch time: The children eat their packed lunches and school dinners in the dining hall. Once they have finished they join the year 1 and year 2 children in the infant playground.
- 13:00—13:15 Yoga
- 13:15–13:45 Maths whole class input and independent work.
- 13:45—14:45 Child Initiated Learning. Children choose which activities they would like to explore inside and outside and their learning is guided by an adult.
- 14:45-15:15 Story time.
- 15:15 Children are picked up by parents from outside the classroom.
