Key features of the mastery approach

**‘I can do maths now because I’m doing the same as everyone else’
Amber (Year 5)**

- Expectation that everyone can achieve
- No class grouping
- Differentiation is provided through different levels of support
- Quick intervention – dealing with misconceptions quickly

Homework

- Homework is given out on a weekly basis to be returned, completed the following week
- **Reading** on a daily basis (may include Reading Plus)
- **Maths:** tasks on Century (online learning platform) plus Times Tables Rock Stars
- **English:** Grammar & Punctuation tasks via Century
- **Spellings:** weekly spellings via Spelling Shed
- Occasional research tasks over a longer period of time
- Child to inform teacher if do not have internet access
- If child finds the task difficult or any other problems arise please let the teacher know as early in the week as possible
