



What is mastery?

Key features of the mastery approach

'I can do maths now because I'm doing the same as everyone else'
Amber (Year 5)

- Expectation that everyone can achieve
- No class grouping
- Differentiation is provided through different levels of support
- Quick intervention dealing with misconceptions quickly

Some of us will be let loose.
We'll be able to explore deeper into the woods, before returning to the group to continue on with the journey

We ALL start the journey together



Nobody will race off ahead on a different journey

Some of us will need additional support along the way

None of us will be left behind

Homework

- Homework is given out on a weekly basis to be returned, completed the following week
- Reading on a daily basis
- Maths: tasks on Century (online learning platform) plus
 Times Tables Rock Stars
- English: Grammar & Punctuation tasks via Century
- · Spellings: weekly spellings via Spelling Shed
- Occasional research tasks over a longer period of time
- Child to inform teacher if do not have internet access
- If child finds the task difficult or any other problems arise please let the teacher know as early in the week as possible
