Bikeability

This week some of our Year 5 & 6 pupils have completed their Level 1 & 2 cycle training. The course is designed to improve cycle control and introduce children to riding on the road. The courses were delivered over 5 daily sessions (one of 2 hours and four of 1 hour 15 minutes). The first session consists of a cycle check, and an assessment of riding skills in a traffic free environment on the school playground. On days 2, 3, 4 and 5, sessions consist of basic manoeuvres and drills on road junctions in the local area. These include left and right hand turns and overtaking parked vehicles. The children did an amazing job and the course instructors from Hertfordshire County Council were very impressed with their cycling abilities. They gave high praise of how the children conducted themselves whilst off site. Well done everyone.

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Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust (HCT) Children's Wellbeing Practitioners regularly run a variety of workshops focused on children and young people's emotional wellbeing and mental health. Some workshops are for the parents/carers of primary school aged children and others are directed at adolescents, although parents can also attend. The workshops aim to provide support, guidance, some strategies and tips to try to improve children and young people's mental health.

The workshops are free to attend and currently take place on Microsoft Teams. They are currently offering workshops on: Wellbeing, Sleep, Self-esteem and Resilience. This week, Year 4 has been exploring what it would look like if we lived in a world without judgement. Together, we discussed how kindness, acceptance, and empathy could shape our relationships and communities. The children shared their thoughts on how a judgement-free world would allow people to express themselves freely, be more open to others' ideas, and embrace differences without fear or prejudice. This really helped the children expand their knowledge of the British value 'tolerance'.

Is your child due to start Nursery or Reception in September 2025?

If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021 you must apply to start an infant or primary school (Reception class) in September 2025. The closing date for Reception class applications is 15 January 2025. You must still apply for a Reception place, even if you already have a place in the Nursery associated with your preferred school.


