<u>Science week.</u> The best time for the children's knowledge to expand as fast as a rocket flies to space. In this article we will be telling you all about what we have been doing during science week, which was held on the 20th of January to the 25th of January. The classes have already learnt tons of information and will surely be ecstatic for whatever is to come!

So what exactly is AI?

The official meaning of AI is artificial intelligence is to create a replica of human intelligence and to make sure that human error is not catastrophic. This may have some advantages and disadvantages, but this doesn't mean it won't improve the world as it is.

Investigations

Currently, year 6 have been learning about artificial intelligence (Al for short) and how far technology has come. The answer is, not as much as we thought. Right now, the most advanced robot is "sophia" created by David Hanson along with the Facial replica of Audrey Hepburn. According to David, he believes that Sophia can use " artificial intelligence, visual data processing and facial recognition." Sophia is the most technologically advanced human like robot to date. She was activated or powered up on the 24th of February 2016. She is also the first robot (to date) to have a nationality, Saudi Arabian. Some quotes from the

Year 4 have been experimenting with different measurements of arm length and making mini-helicopters, to demonstrate what different adjustments need to be made in order to get airborne.

Year 2 have been investigating absorbent and non-absorbent materials to find out which material suits best to make a bedding for a variety of animals.

Year 1 have been categorising the different animals, figuring out which type of glass is transparent, translucent or blurred. Finally, they have been studying magnets and force.


Reception have been doing a flurry of investigations such as melting ice and seeing the different concentrations of water, in addition to this they have also been arranging different dinosaurs into groups of species.

Charles Darwin <u>1809-1882</u>

Charles Darwin was born in February 1809 and he died in April 1882.He is famous mostly for his study in natural selection (Evolution) and his idea, which he adopted from Jean Lamarck (1744-1829), that **all species of life have evolved from their ancestors ;**This is called evolution.

Evolution is the idea that animals, over a period of time, are believed to have been developed from earlier forms (animals) during the history of the earth. Charles Darwin developed this idea and even brought evidence proving his theory that evolution is real on his 5 year voyage on the HMS Beagle in detail. His book, published in 1859 called "The Origin Of Species", which detailed so much of his hard-earned research on natural selection, contained so many aspects of "his" science that it backed his at-the-time crazy theory and become a great work in the field of biology. This new work stunned scientists laughing at him and Charles Darwin became a famous person to the world.

Although, later in life he suffered from injuries and illness,but inspirationally he pressed on and continued with his research and made new experiments to support his ideas and forming new branches to his study, the evolution tree. Darwin's ideas created a lot of discussions impacting a variety of religious and scientific beliefs,making the science he invented global.

Fun Facts

Charles Darwin lived in Shrewsbury and had 5 brothers and sisters and had 10 children! He hated the sight of blood, which is why he quitted medical school, and even once appeared on the £10 note! He waited more than 20 years to prove his theory on evolution, and almost gave up! Luckily, he didn't and became fixed in the history of science.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is the ability of a computer or a machine to think and learn. It is also a field of study which tries to make computers 'smart'. Some people also consider AI a danger to people if it continues to progress at its current pace.

The most successful AI platform we have up to date is TensorFlow. Initially released in 2015, TensorFlow is an open source machine learning framework that is easy to use and deploy across a variety of platforms. A.I is one of the most controversial things that humanity has indulged in ever. 
