


Governor Newsletter Spring 2018

During the Spring Term the Governors have been in school conducting a variety of visits including Science, Special Educational Needs, PE, Sports Premium, More Able, Religious Education, Children Looked After along with several Year Group visits.

The Governors have also been attending training in order to full fill requirements and increase knowledge and understanding.

The Leys have been accredited for our commitment by NACE-The National Association for More Able Children in Education this term and the Governors would like to acknowledge the hard work and commitment from all members of the school community, especially Mrs Khangura, on achieving this.

A NACE assessor visited our school on 31st January; observing lessons and interviewing pupils, teachers, parents and governors. She was particularly impressed by importance placed on the needs of more able learners. Mrs

Khangura, Deputy Headteacher who led this award commented that it was valuable to have the whole school community involved.











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My name is Barry Hack and I am the vice-chair of Governors. One of my responsibilities is the Science link. This involves monitoring activities at school involving Science and meeting with Ms Chandraratna and the pupils to discuss everything to do with the teaching and learning of Science. I make sure we are following the national curriculum and the pupils are learning and progressing with Science, whether as a direct subject or embedded within other lessons.

In that role, I recently sat in a 'Mad Science' assembly, sponsored by Affinity Water, with Key Stage 2 pupils and staff. This one involved the now infamous "Nitro Nick" and his sidekick "Toxic Tom" performing a number of awesome experiments involving water. During the course of the presentation, a number of serious questions were asked, such as: how much fresh water is there in the world; is there any water in the assembly hall; how long does rain take to reach the aquifer and how can we reduce our water consumption. A few of the children were asked to assist with the experiments in a fun and entertaining way, earning a two minute tooth brushing sand-timer as a reward. An occasional flurry of squeals and laughter could be heard when an unexpected shot of water was sprayed from a water pistol in to the air...

Later in the day, I heard many children were discussing water usage whilst in class or in the playground. They recognised if they turned off the tap whilst brushing their teeth they could each save 6,000 litres per year!!

Activities like this make Science fun and I always try to attend such events as I have as much fun as the children and staff. I can't wait for the next one....
