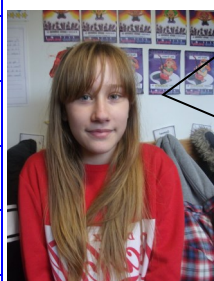
SHOULD THE AGE LIMIT OF FORTNITE BE RAISED?
