English

During our daily English sessions, we will build in GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) practice. This includes:

- ❖Sentence structure
- ♦How we use punctuation
- ❖Vocabulary choices
- ♦Sound patterns/phonics

In writing, we will be studying a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry. Topics will include, Africa, Climate change action, Egyptians, Vikings, Anglo Saxons

Year 4 English outcomes

- Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting- pen licence
- Using commas after fronted adverbials (Later that day,)
- Using and punctuating direct speech
 - Choosing effective vocabulary

Outcomes in Reading

By the end of Year 4, your child should be able to:

- listen to and discuss a wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks.
- use dictionaries to check the meaning of words that they have read
- draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence

Reading at home

It's undeniable that a child's reading skills are important to their success in school, work, and life in general.

Reading supports cognitive development

Reading to young children is proven to improve and help along the process of cognitive development. Cognitive development is the ability to think and understand; includes remembering, problem solving, and decision-making.

Spelling at home

Please support your child at home to learn their spellings. This can be done in a variety of ways, including:

- Look, cover, write, check
- Sounding out, using phonics
- Finding words within words (root words)
- Chunking the word into syllables
- Rainbow and pyramid writing
- Year 3/4 spelling word list



Maths

Mastery

Approach to

- Problem solving skills
- Mental arithmetic
- Written skills

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Areas covered include: number, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, geometry, measures and statistics.

Children will apply these skills to different scenarios throughout to help deepen their understanding and show how mathematics is used in everyday situations.

Multiplication times table test

Government has introduced a new online multiplication times table check for 8 and 9 year olds.

- Recall multiplication tables up to 12 × 12
- Needs to be able to recall times tables at random quickly

Year 4 will attend swimming lessons every <u>Wednesday</u> afternoon. Please ensure that earrings and jewellery are taken off and hair is tied back. Girls must wear full swimsuits and boys must wear swimming shorts which are <u>above</u> the knee.

They should read for at least 20 minutes per day and have their Reading Record signed by an adult everyday.

- -Children can upload work using Google Docs/ Slides and 'share' to their teacher


Online Classroom Supports:
