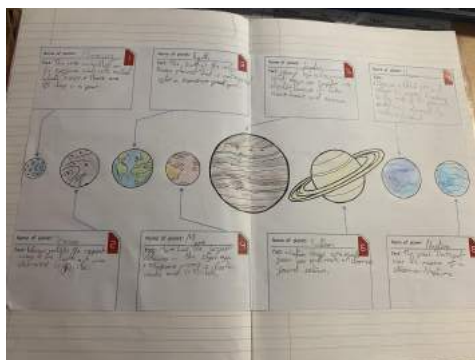

Across the school, scientists have been buzzing with excitement!

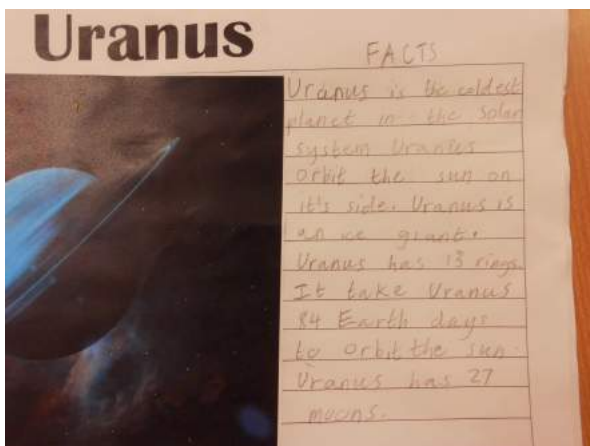
In year 5, the children are starting to learn about Space, ahead of their trip to Airbus Defence and Space.

Malala class also showed they were adept at working with datasets during a Geography lesson which explored climates zones as part of a local area study. The children compared local weather data versus the average temperatures and rainfall for the UK.

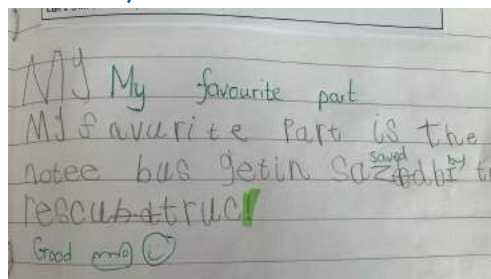
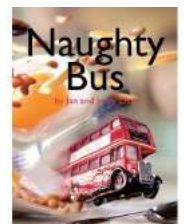
Whilst in History as part of our WWII topic, the children learnt about the impact of German air raids (see excerpt from Christina's book). This leads nicely into Monday when all of the children in Year 6 will be designing and making Anderson shelters.

Method	Description	How did it keep people safe?	Draw a diagram
Gas masks	A gas mask looks like a mask with two see through eyes with a long nose bit	It kept people safe because if there was a toxic explosion they would be able to breathe	
Shelters	A shelter is underground and it looks like a hill. It keeps you safe	It helped people by giving them shelter to keep them safe	
The blackout	The blackout is when you have to close your curtains and switch your lights off	It kept people safe by making sure that the bombers don't know that you are there	
Evacuation	Evacuation is when children have to move to another country/city	It keeps you safe by making sure that the city that has been bombed has been evacuated so
