Absence

Whole School Attendance

As a school we aim for **96%** attendance which would bring us in line with the National average. This is a very ambitious target this year with the impact Covid has had so far. With your help, we are hoping to get as close to this figure as possible in 2022-2023 though!



This year our school has achieved <mark>93.8%</mark> attendance. We have 160 children who have managed 96% attendance or better so far this term, with 140 of those pupils exceeding the target for the whole year as well.

Class rewards include baking, board games, and non-uniform days.

How does your child compare? (attendance data can be found at the top of their report)

Attendance during one school year	Equals this number of days absent	which is approximately this many weeks absent	which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons

Frequent absence can add up to a considerable amount of lost learning and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life.

Medical

Medical appointments should be made outside of school time,

- if this is not possible parents should bring in the appointment letter to the school before the day of the appointment.

-Parents should bring their child into school as soon as possible following the appointment. -Sometimes brothers and sisters are removed from school due to their sibling's medical appointment. This is not appropriate and will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances. -If a sibling is removed due to a medical appointment that is not their own, this will be

recorded as an unauthorised absence.



Please be aware that the government continues to regard holidays during term time as unauthorised unless there are exceptional circumstances to consider. Parents who decide to take pupils on holiday during term time may incur a fine. Details of fines are as follows;

Penalty Notice Issued: £60 per parent per child per day If not paid by 22nd day of receipt: £120 per parent per child per day If not paid by 28th day of receipt: Parents generally prosecuted in court.
