In year 1 we have been learning about the Jewish celebration Shabbat. Children have been learning about this special day and how it's celebrated. We have also been looking at special days in our own lives and how we celebrate them.

Shabbat is the Jewish Day of Rest. Shabbat happens each week from sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday. During Shabbat, Jewish people remember the story of creation from the Torah and eat foods including challah (braided bread) and wine (or grape juice), which are both blessed before the meal begins.

We will be holding our own Shabbat celebration to see how this is celebrated each week and we will try grape juice and challah bread.


Fraiser is a keen footballer. He scored 5 goals in the last game of the season, winning the match and getting MOT. Fraiser had a great season scoring 39 goals.
