The Secrets Of Black Rock

Over the next two weeks, the whole school are focussing on The Secrets of Black Rock by Joe Todd-Stanton.

Have a look at some of the fun things each year group will be doing:

EYFS will be describing The Black Rock, describing how Erin feels at different points of the story and describing the beautiful scene below the Black Rock. They will also be making starfish, a playdough black rock and fish art.

Year 1 will be designing sea creatures that might live on the black rock and creating descriptive pieces of writing about them. In their art lesson, they will be using watercolours to make sea creatures.

Year 2 will be creating Non-fiction information reports based on the different sea creatures. In their art lessons, they will be experimenting with paint and tools to make sea creatures.

Year 3 will be writing a story from Black Rock's perspective. In their art lessons, they will be creating watercolour turtles.

Year 4 will be creating their own conversation between Erin and the black rock. In their art lessons, they will be making recycled jellyfish.

Year 5 will be creating an informal, tension-filled diary entry from Erins perspective. In their art lessons, they will be creating an ocean themed SET design and sketching sea creatures.

Year 6 will be writing a persuasive letter to the mayor to convince him to save Black Rock. In their art lessons, they will be creating an ocean mosaic using recyclable materials.
