For STEAM week, the whole school have been looking at art based on our Take One Book - The Secret of Black Rock.

Year 6 are creating an ocean mosaic including sea creatures using recyclable materials.

Year 5 are creating an ocean themed set design and learning to sketch different sea creatures Year 4 are creating recycled jellyfish

In maths, we have been practising counting in steps of 2,5 and 10 as well as learning all about arrays.
