

Subject - Art

This week the children in nursery have been exploring their topic of minibeasts through Art. The children have been enjoying using playdough, string, glass beads and lolly sticks to make various minibeasts As the children were making their models they were counting how many legs each minibeast needed and we talked about how many eyes they had. In the painting area the children have been painting paper plates which they will turn into minibeasts. There were lots of spiders and bees being made. The children had to think about which colour they would use for their chosen minibeast and carefully paint stripes on the bees. Working with another adult some of the children were making spider hats where they were independently selecting strips of paper to glue to their band counting out the correct number of legs.







Class: Murphy

This week Murphy Class have been learning about keeping our teeth healthy. They have learnt instructions for how to brush their teeth correctly, carried out an experiment with egg shells to see what happens when they are put in different liquids such as water and orange juice to show what happens to their teeth if they drink too much of these and practiced correctly brushing their teeth.
