Well here is the cookie recipe...

125g butter

100g soft light brown sugar

125g caster sugar

- 1 egg
- Itsp vanilla extract

225g self raising flour

- 1/2 tsp salt
- 200g chocolate chips.

Preheat oven to 180 cream butter and sugars then add the egg and vanilla. Add the flour salt and chocolate chips. Roll into balls or a log and cut into slices. Leave room between them on a tray because they will spread in the oven. Bake for 7 minutes until just setting so they are soft and doughy. Let them harden on the tray for a few minutes before transferring to a cooling rack.




## <u>The highlight of the week in Year 3</u> <u>-Wilson</u> We had lots of children on our
