Covid-19 update

Due to the number of Outbreaks this week across the school, we would like all parents/ visitors on site to wear a mask on school site.

As stated in my previous letter, Hertfordshire County council agreed sibling rule is no longer something that is being applied. However all children aged 5 and above who are close contacts, whether in households or at school, can now conduct 7 days of daily LFTs, which is detailed in the close contact guidance

Symptoms to monitor

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported - ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus.

Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

Key symptoms:

- A new continuous cough and/or
- High temperature and/or
- A loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

Additional symptoms that may be early warning signs of COVID-19 in children include:

- **upset stomach, headache, sore throat, unusual fatigue and change in complex.**

Mathematics

At The Leys we are striving for pupils to acquire a deep, long term, secure and adaptable understanding of maths. This is being achieved through our focus on children becoming fluent in working with number; being able to reason mathematically and also apply their knowledge to solve mathematical problems. These attributes are embedded within all of our maths lessons and are developed consistently over time.



Our curriculum also supports children 'bridging the gap' between abstract mathematical concepts and concrete representations that they can manipulate (see photographs) to help them answer questions and solve problems.



In recent 'pupil voice' sessions, it was great to hear our children talk enthusiastically about their maths lessons and how they love to solve problems by applying their knowledge and skills.

CLASS OF THE WEEK





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WELLBEING



On the INSET day at the start of the term, all the teachers completed training on 'Understanding the Early Signs of Child Fear and Worries' with the Stevenage Mental Health workers. We learnt that worrying is a normal and natural occurrence, which helps us to perform at our best in situations such as interviews or exams. Also about how thoughts, emotions, behaviour and body sensations are linked and how to spot the early signs of potential problems in children. Moreover, that worries can be classified into two groups; rational worries, such as leaving a parent or irrational/hypothetical worries, such as the dark. Staff were also given 7 strategies to use when responding to anxious children and further resources from the Anna Freud centre to support children with fears and worries. If your child is struggling with worries, please talk to their class teacher about ideas to support them with this.

BREAKFAST CLUB

- Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am to 8:45 am and includes breakfast.
- Breakfast club costs £3.50 per child per day.
- Children must be signed into the club by whoever is bringing them to school.
- Children should not be dropped at the gate and sent into the club on their own. Breakfast on offer includes such choices as: cereal, toast, croissants, fruit, and fruit juices.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

- After School Club runs from 3.15 to 6.00 pm in two sessions:
- 3.15 - 5:00pm Session A £7.00 per day per child
- 3.15 - 6.00 pm Session B £8.50 per day per child
