
Children across the school love finding out about the past.


This week Year 3 have been researching Stevenage in the past, present and what it will look like in the future. https://stevenage-even-better.com/history-of-stevenage/

Problems. If you would like copies of the information shared or have an idea for another training next term please email the admin team.


The Leys Have Talent
